Eligibility

- Bursaries are means tested:
- Household incomes over £65,000 are unlikely to be awarded a bursary.
- Bursaries are awarded dependent on performing exceptionally well in assessments. The benchmark varies from year to year.
- Awards may vary from 10% to 100% fee remission.
- Bursaries are awarded at the Head's discretion.

Bursaries and Scholarships



The Grange Senior School provides a number of bursaries (by way of a reduction in fees) for students starting Year 7 at the Senior School and Year 12 for Sixth Form. The 'Access to Excellence' bursary is aimed at the Most Able and Talented children, making a Grange education more accessible with the potential to cover up to 100% of school fees.

Bursaries

Who can qualify?

Bursaries are means-tested and are based on parental income and assets. A strong Year 7 entrance assessment or evidence of high achievement in GCSE examinations (for Year 12 entry) are essential.

When to apply?

Year 7 Bursaries

Detailed financial information is required by the end of November. The bursary will be awarded in February for entry into school the following September and will be reviewed each year. Continuation of the award is subject to yearly reviews of family finances, and good student conduct and progress.

Year 12 Bursaries

Bursaries are available for external students entering the Sixth Form. Continuation of the award is subject to yearly reviews of family finances, and good student conduct and progress.

Scholarships

Academic Scholarship

Academic Scholarships are awarded annually at 11+ based on the results of the entrance assessment, with successful candidates benefitting from a 20% remission on school fees. The award will be reviewed annually and students are expected to maintain excellent academic progress.

Sixth Form Scholarship

The Sixth Form Scholarship takes place in the Spring Term and is an honorary award dependent upon:

- Performance in the Sixth Form Scholarship Examination
- Exceptional performance in GCSE examinations
- Overall character, behaviour and attitude towards studies

Scholars will be presented with the Scholarship Award at our Prizegiving event, as well as having their names added to the Scholarship Board in our Sixth Form Centre. They will also receive leadership training to help carry out duties such as supporting prefects.

One Music Scholarship will be offered annually to a student entering Year 7 and can continue throughout their time at The Grange*. The scholarship attracts a reduction in school fees of up to 20%, as well as complimentary tuition in one instrument (including voice) at school.

To be eligible the student must be able to play two instruments, or one instrument and voice. They must be Grade 4 standard on at least one instrument or in singing, and also take part in an audition which will involve the following:

- Perform a piece of music on each of their instruments, or on one instrument and a vocal (accompanied if necessary**)
- Perform sight-reading and aural tests at a standard that reflects musical experiences
- Discuss musical interests and accomplishments

Music Scholarship

The Music Scholarship audition will take place in January. The offer of a Music Scholarship is dependent upon the candidate's performance in the entrance assessment.

**The contribution to the Music Scholarship is reviewed annually with the Director of Music, and the school reserves the right to terminate a scholarship after discussion with parents if it is felt that the student is not sufficiently committed to the musical life of the school. **The school must be notified in advance if an accompanist of the student's own choice is required.*
